

**Providing integrated services to
migrants – A case study from Seme
Border Nigeria**

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Integration

- Training of healthcare workers on syndromic management of sexually transmitted infections
- Equipping information centre with charts and drugs for treatment of STIs
- Upgrading of physical infrastructure
- Provision of family planning counselling services
- Provision of immunization services during IPDs

Result

- Over a period of 6 months (Jan – June 2011)
- 994 migrants were counseled and tested for HIV
- 448 were either counseled on STI/treated for STI
- 16,900 free male & female condoms were distributed
- 81 females were referred for family planning services (21 HIV positive and 60 HIV negative)
