# METHODS

- The method used is service provision through MSM/MSW friendly Drop-in Service Centers (DISCs)
- MSM/MSW trained peer educators participate in in-reach activities and health education days aimed at educating their peers on HIV/AIDS/STIs and referring them for services at the DISCs
- The services provided at the DISCs include; HTC, STI screening and treatment, family planning services, condom and lubricant promotion and distribution and referrals for other reproductive health services.
