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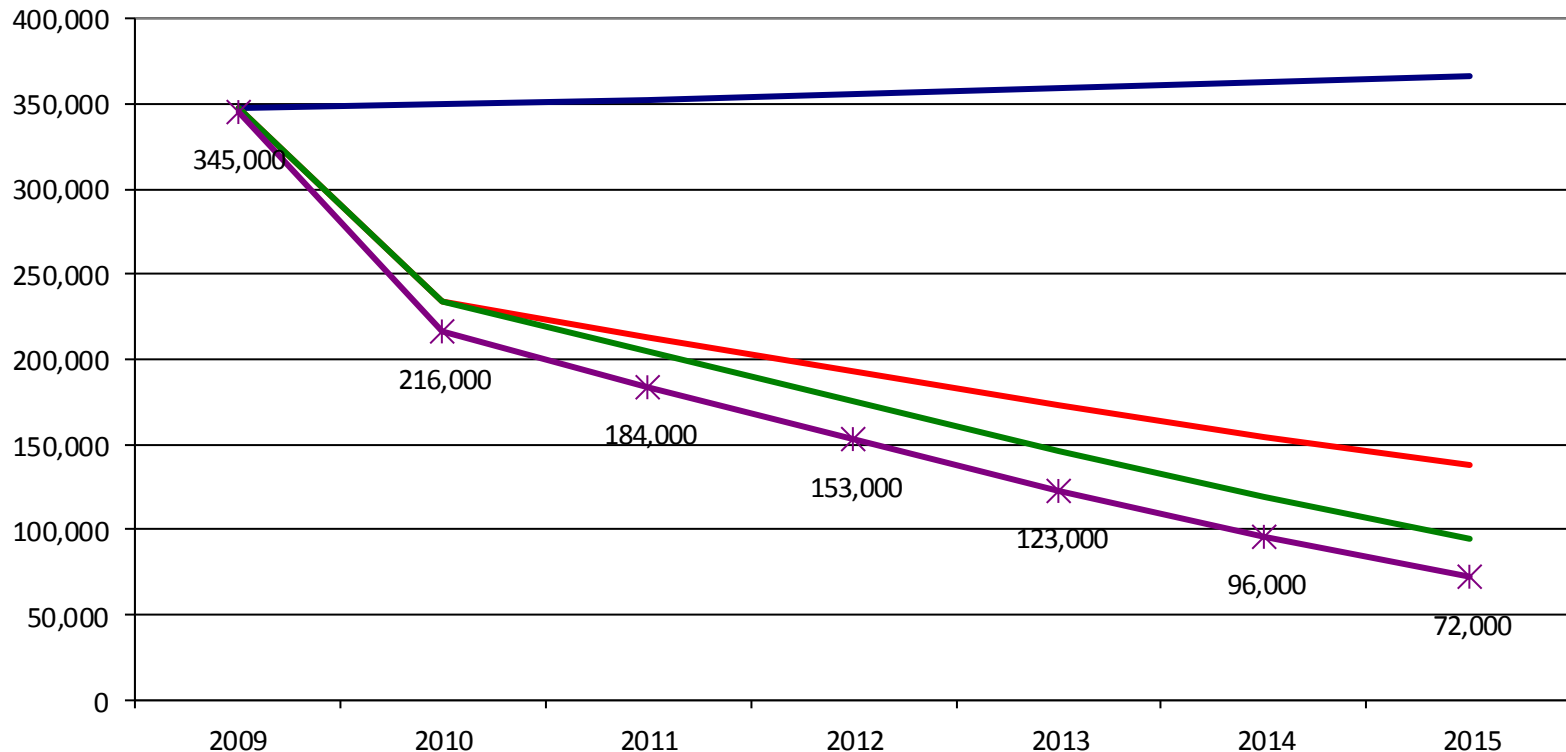


# Swaziland - a brief overview

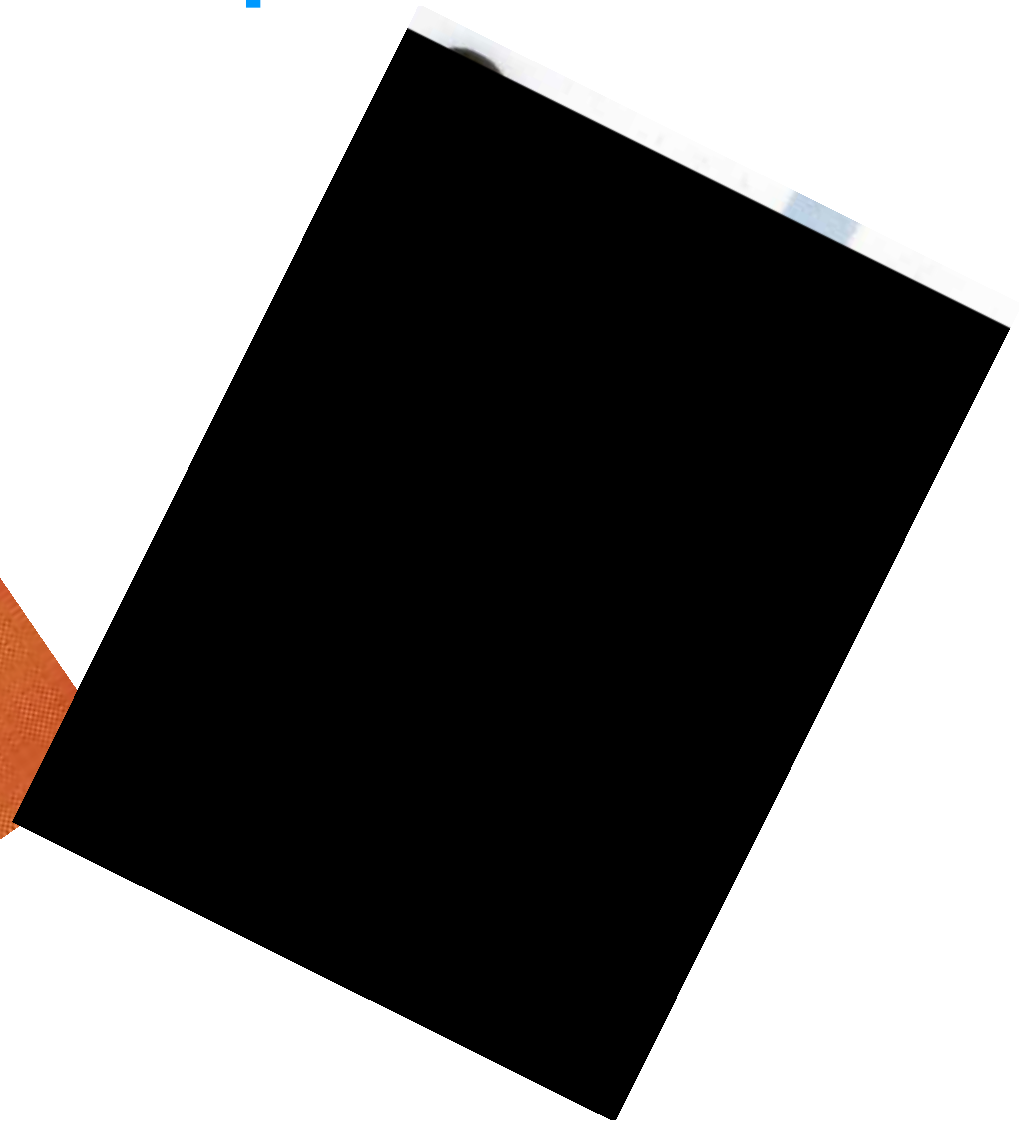
- HIV prevalence (DHS 2007): 26%
- Number of ANC facilities providing PMTCT services (SAM 2010): 88% (150/171)
- Estimated number of HIV-positive pregnant women (2011): 13,200
- PMTCT coverage (MOH annual report 2011): 86%
- Proportion of children born from HIV+ mothers who are testing HIV+ at 18 months (UNGASS 2010) 17%
