Methods

Study Design

- **Cross-sectional study**
- **Data collected at 1 year (endline) of a cluster randomized trial**
 - 12 Intervention sites: integrated FP & HIV services
 - 6 Control sites: referral for FP services

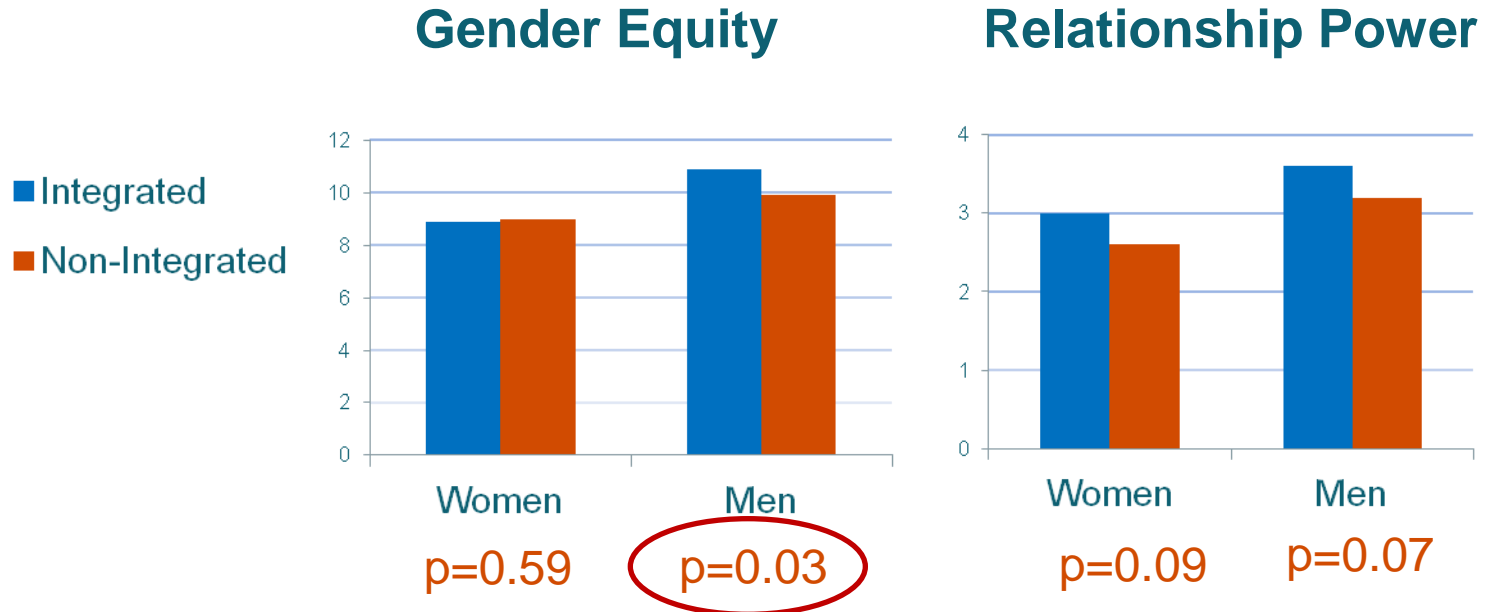
Procedures

- **957 women & men interviewed using the Gender Relations Scale**

Analyses

- **Multivariable regression to examine differences in attitudes by Intervention**

Key Results



- **Among women**, integration may improve contraceptive use, but it does not appear to improve gender equitable attitudes.
- **Among men**, integration may improve gender equitable attitudes.
